


Arnar Corktree	The tree grows between 40 and 50 ft and is named for its heavily ridged corky bark.	
22 Black Cherry	This tree has leaves that are 3-6 inches long. The fruit are less than an inch in diameter.	
23 Green Ash	It is a medium-sized deciduous tree reaching 50-80 ft tall and has a trunk as large as 18 inches in diameter.	
24 Crabapple	A small tree that grows from 10 - 25 ft at maturity. The flowers have five petals and may be white, pink or red.	
25 Hornbeam	This tree has leaves that range from 1.5-2 inches. Also known by the name musclewood.	
26 Bur Oak	A large deciduous tree, growing 100ft in height, and is one of the most massive oaks with a trunk diameter of up to 10ft.	
27 Osage Orange	A smaller tree that grows from 25-50 ft. Its fruit is round and bumpy growing 2-4 inches in diameter.	
28 Pin Oak	The leaves of this tree are 2-6 inches long and 2-5 inches broad. A very common tree in New York City.	
29 White Pine	This tree has "needles" that are in bundles of 5. It grows above canopies in order to reach the sun.	
30 Sycamore Maple	Grows 65-115 ft and has smooth gray bark that becomes rougher with age. Its leaves are 3-9 inches long.	



31 Himalayan Pine	The "needles" are in bundles of 5 and are roughly 6 inches long, normally drooping gracefully.	
32 Magnolia	The outside of these flowers are tough to avoid damage by eating and crawling beetles.	
33 Sugar Maple	It is the largest of the American Maple at 100-129 ft tall. The leaves are 2.5-5 inches long and wide.	
34 European Beech	Can reach a height of 100 ft and a trunk diameter of 10ft. It has a long lifespan reaching 150-200 years.	
35 English Elm	A tree reaching heights of 30 ft tall and a trunk diameter of 6.5 ft. The leaves are dark green, almost orbicular.	
36 Ornamental Cherry	A smaller tree growing 15-25 ft with chestnut colored bark. Its white and red flowers begin to develop in April.	
37 Red Bud	This tree grows 25-40 ft tall with smooth, dark bark. It is named for its red buds in the Spring.	
38 Copper Beech	A variety of European Beech, this tree produces leaves in Spring that are purplish-green and turn dark green by the summer.	
39 Willow Oak	This oak has leaves that are slender and smooth. The tree can reach over 60 feet in height at maturity.
